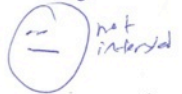

What they're good for

- Check assumptions about users
- Sorting and storing all the research
- Making decisions later on
- Staying in touch with your users

Personas

How to make them

- Talk to lots of users
- Ideally use real quotes from people
- Do some structured interviews
- Feed in any analytics or feedback
- Prioritise
- **Test them on users**

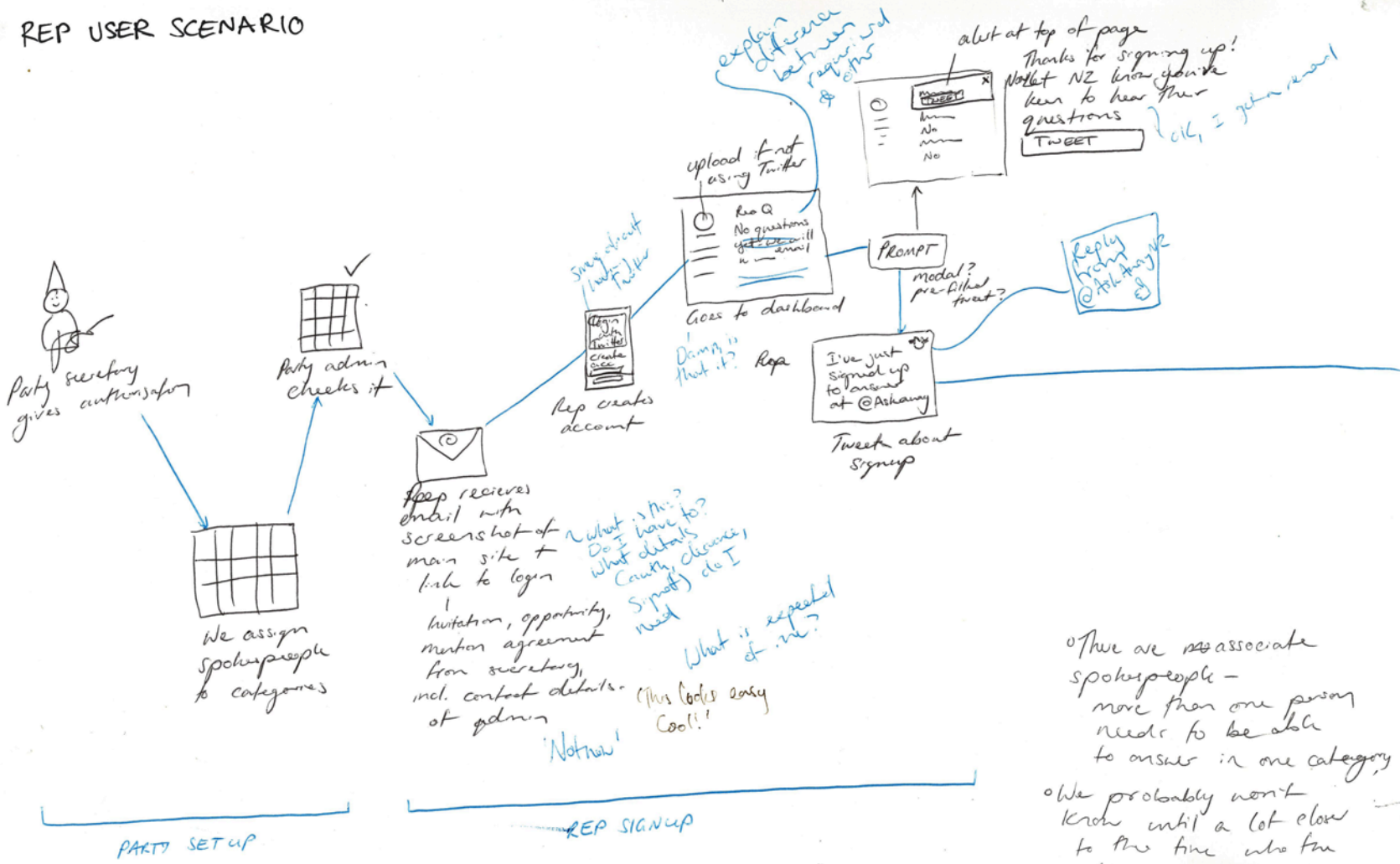

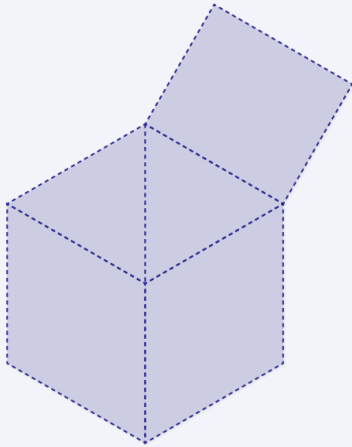

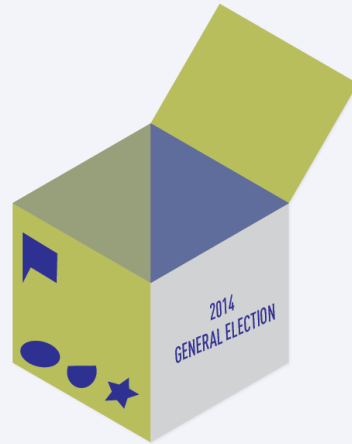
Source Code

What is it?
The blueprints for the site, all the functionality (the Ruby on Rails) with all the layout (the CSS and JS). An empty shell with minimal branding.

Who does it belong to?
Contributor's complete Contributor Agreements that assign copyright to the project.

Who can use it?
Under the AGPL open source license, anyone can use the source code, for free, including for commercial purposes, and no one can stop future people from using it for free.

Where does it live?
On Github, which is a site where code can be stored, downloaded and contributed to, in an open repository.



2014 Instance

What is it?
A version of the site, using a copy of the source code, but live on a server. It has visual branding specific to the election and any media partners added on top of the base styling.

Who does it belong to?
This is more the responsibility of Massey University and Meg's project. It is also something that could be partly owned by a media partner. IP laws would apply to protect the visual identity of the site.

Who can use it?
This site is public as it is on the internet for anyone to find and interact with.

Where does it live?
On a server.



Dynamic Content

What is it?
All the content that users generate when they interact with the site.

Who does it belong to?
By default I think the same people who own the instance of the site would have the rights to the content.

Who can use it?
This can be freely available for anyone to use and share under a Creative Commons license, with attribution to the source (which might include attributing media partners).

Where does it live?
In the database on the server with the rest of this instance of the site. It is publically viewable through the website.



Metrics

What is it?
All the information gathered about the way users interact with the site.

Who does it belong to?
Whoever the instance of the site belongs to, and also Google and Facebook.

Who can use it?
Whoever the owners of the site give access to - any interested research institutions or agencies to begin with, but it also has commercial potential.

Where does it live?
In the Google Analytics and Facebook Insights accounts attached to the site. This can be exported to CSV or PDF too.

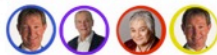

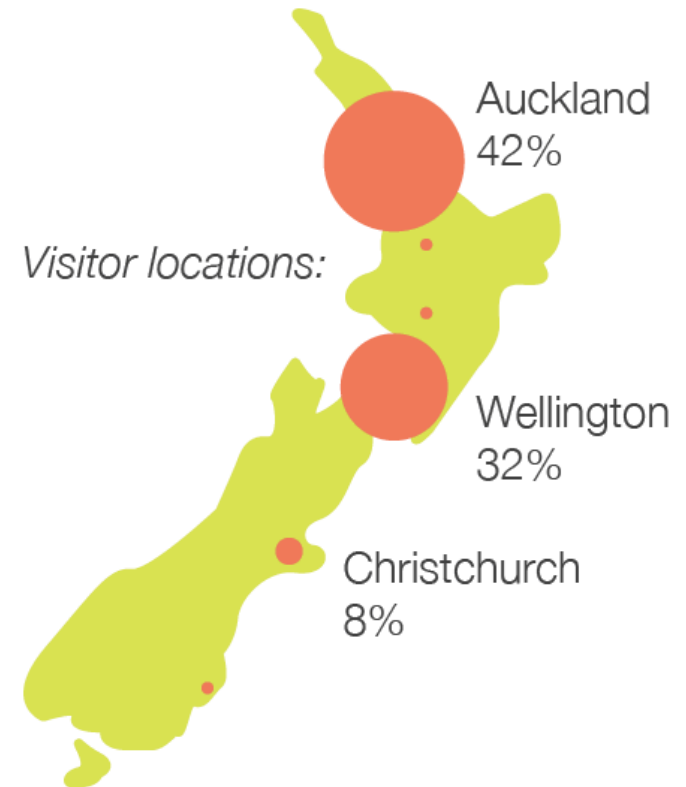

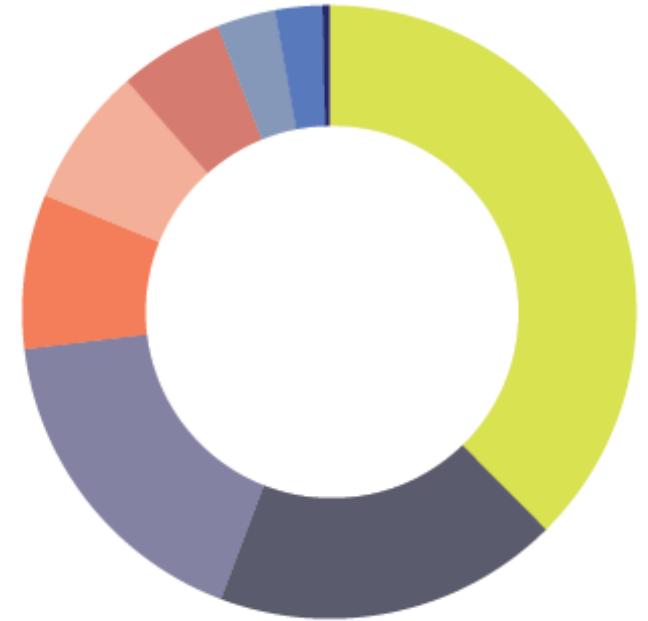

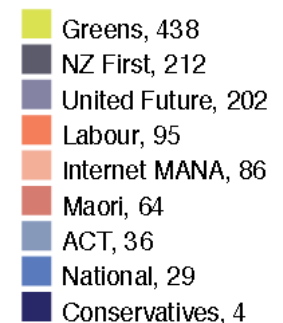
Amount of answers by party:
